Dear Parents/Guardians,

Please note the following points:-

**1. Punctuality in the School:**

Parents are once again reminded of the School Time. Your ward needs to reach the School before the 1<sup>st</sup> bell. Late comers may need to go back home. Parents are requested to take this matter seriously and co-operate with the school.

2. All the students are to reach the school in prescribed school uniform. Those students who violate the dress code need to pay the fine of Rs.50/- . All the students are asked to take care of the school property as their own and give the prior importance for everything provided by the school. The use of language in the School Campus is English. All the students must abide with this rule.

3. Parents those who have not enrolled their wards after promotion to the higher class by paying the Annual fee, Tuition fee and exam fee are requested to do it for the month of April & May 2018. Those who fail to pay the fee of 2 months may need to pay the fine of Rs. 200/- afterwards. For the collection of fee for the month of April & May counter will be opened till 12<sup>th</sup> May 2018.

Parents and students please note that those students who destroy the materials of Smart Class will be fined Rs. 2000/-.

4. Parents those who wish to apply for the T.C are requested to place the application before 12<sup>th</sup> May 2018.

5. Parents are not allowed to take their ward during the class hours. In case of emergency you need to take the child out of school campus only with the copy of ID card (Parent's copy). If your ward is sick or need medical treatment please keep them absent from the school.

6. The CBSE strictly forbids the use of mobile phones, electronic gadgets, etc... in the school. Those students who are found with any kind of electronic gadgets, valuable materials ,jewellery and those who ride the two wheeler to come to the school will be issued T.C from the School, if they are found guilty of the same.

7. **Summer Holidays:** Summer Vacation starts from 14/5/2018 to 17/6/2018. All the students will be sufficiently assigned holiday home work, task, and projects in different subjects. All the students shall complete the tasks during the holidays.

8. Re-opening of the school on 18/06/2018(Monday). It is compulsory for all students to be present on 18/6/2018. Morning class Time Table to be followed for the month of June 2018. For the month of June the fee deposit to be done from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2018. Time : 6:45 a.m – 11:15 a.m.

9. **C.B.S.E Board result of Class X & XII:** The result will be displayed on the Notice Board. The marksheet and Migration certificates will be issued to the parent/students after its arrival from CBSE Office. An authorization letter to be produced if any parent authorizes the 2<sup>nd</sup> person to collect the same from the School Office. Students those who have issued library books may submit before the collection of certificates and those who have lost the book may need to pay the amount of the book.

**10. Admission to Class XI on 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21st June 2018. Time 8.00 a.m – 12.00 noon.**

Students of St. Joseph's School, NTPC will be admitted to Plus Two (Class XI) based on the Merit List. The students should obtain 80% marks in English, Science and Mathematics to take the admission along with character and discipline of the students. (Character and discipline of previous years will be considered.) Class XI classes begins from 25/6/2018.

11. **Admission Test to Class XI for other school** : Admission Test will be there for students of other schools on 16<sup>th</sup> June 2018 at 7:30 a.m.

**13. Parents please note the following instructions from the CBSE Board for the Examinations from the academic year 2017 – 2018.**

1.The restoration of Board Examination for class X and revised assessment structure and examination for class X from Academic Year 2017-18 onwards. This new scheme will bring the uniformity in the system of assessment and examination for classes IX and X in all the CBSE affiliated schools. To increase the confidence in the students to start preparing for class X Board examination when they join the upper primary stage in class VI, the CBSE has decided to implement the uniform system of assessment, examination pattern and issue of report cards for classes VI to VIII also on the similar pattern. While keeping in view the provisions of Right to Education Act, 2009, the scheme for classes VI-VIII has been designed on Term Assessment basis with gradual increase in the learning assessment as the students move forward. This would prepare the students to cover the whole syllabus of the academic year and face the challenge of class X Board examination, and would thus, ensure the 'quality of education'.

2. With restoration of class- X Board examination, the CBSE will issue the report card for class - X based on the Board examination with effect from Academic Year 2017-18. As the assessment structure and examination pattern for class - IX will be similar to that of class - X, the report card for class IX issued by the schools should also be similar to that of class -X.

2.1 **Scholastic Area:** The assessment structure and examination for classes VI to VIII have been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009 and comprises of two terms i.e. Term-1 and 2 as explained below:
